

Cargo Ship Sinks After Collision Near Strait of Hormuz, Iranian Media Says

Twenty-three crew members were rescued as a bulk carrier ship sank near the Strait of Hormuz on Tuesday, July 14, after colliding with another vessel, according to [Iranian state-run media](#).

The collision occurred north of Qeshm Island and caused the the ship to flood, prompting an emergency evacuation, [reports](#) said.

Marine traffic data [showed](#) the bulk carrier was en route to Jebel Ali Port, on the outskirts of Dubai, at the time of the collision.

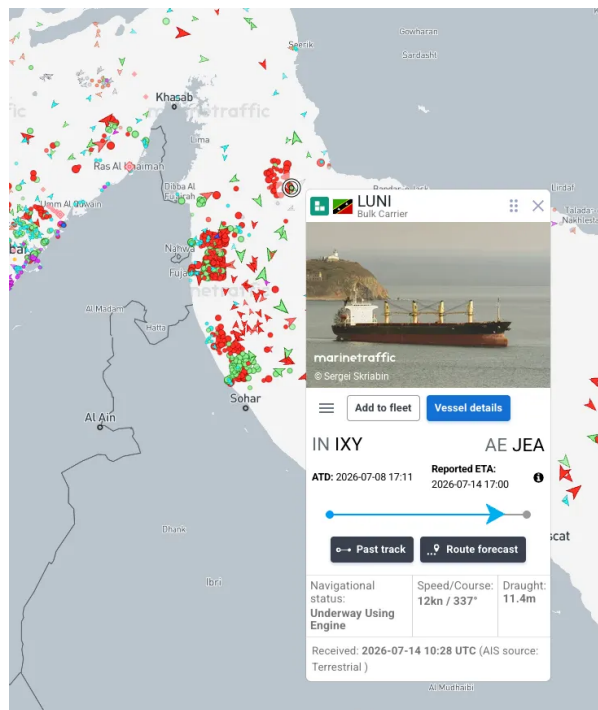

Location - *Corroborated* - Gulf of Oman

Marine traffic data shows the ship's last location in the Gulf of Oman (see date cluster). Iranian authorities [said](#) the collision occurred north of Qeshm Island.

Where is the ship?

Bulk Carrier **LUNI** is currently located in the **Oman Gulf** (reported **1 day, 7 hours ago**)

What kind of ship is this?

LUNI (IMO: 9070711) is a **Bulk Carrier** and is sailing under the flag of **SAINT KITTS AND NEVIS**. Her length overall (LOA) is 184.99 meters and her width is 30.5 meters.

Source - *Unconfirmed* - Unknown

The source of the footage is unknown.
